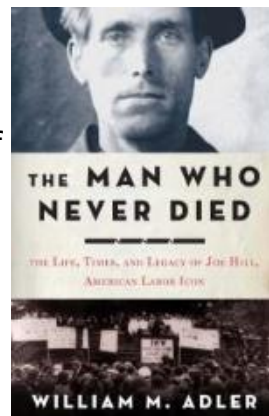

**The Man Who Never Died:
The Life, Times and Legacy of Joe Hill, American Labor Icon**

with author William M. Adler and musician Hali Hammer

In 1914, Joe Hill was convicted of murder in Utah and sentenced to death by firing squad. Many believed Hill was innocent, condemned for his association with the Industrial Workers of the World— the radical Wobblies. Now, William M. Adler gives us the first full-scale biography of Joe Hill, and presents evidence that comes as close as one can to definitively exonerating him. Hill's tale is set between the century's turn and World War I, when the call for industrial unionism struck a deep chord among disenfranchised workers; when class warfare raged and capitalism was on the run.
